

St Matthew 6:24-33

24 No man can serve two masters. For either he will hate the one, and love the other: or he will sustain the one, and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. **25** Therefore I say to you, be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat: and



the body more than the raiment? **26** Behold the birds of the air, for they neither sow, nor do they reap, nor gather into barns: and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are not you of much more value than they? **27** And which of you by taking thought, can add to his stature by one cubit? **28** And for raiment why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they labour not, neither do they spin. **29** But I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. **30** And if the grass of the field, which is today, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, God doth so clothe: how much more you, O ye of little faith? **31** Be not solicitous therefore, saying, What shall we eat: or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? **32** For after all these things do the heathens seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. **33** Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and his justice, and all these things shall be added unto you.
