The Feast of the Holy Family 13 January 2008

O Lord Jesus Christ, who when Thou wast subject to Mary and Joseph didst sanctify the home life with ineffable virtues: grant that by their assistance, we may be instructed by the example of Thy Holy Family and become partakers of their eternal happiness: Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost.

The Feast of the Holy Family has its origins in the 17th century when devotion to the Holy Family was quite strong. The feast itself was instituted by Pope Leo XIII in 1893 and was extended to the whole Roman Church by Pope Benedict XV in 1921. It is celebrated on the Sunday after Epiphany.
